Rising to a height of 112 metres, the 700-year-old **Dom**Tower on Dom Square is the iconic symbol of Utrecht.

A guided tour of the tower is a must during your visit to the city. Right beside Dom Tower is the delightful gothic **Dom Church**. Descend to **DOMunder**, an underground voyage of discovery full of archaeological treasures and venture 2,000 years back in time. Then discover the **Pandhof garden of Dom Church**. This monastery garden is the loveliest courtyard in the Netherlands.



The most famous house in Utrecht, completely designed according to the principles of De Stijl art movement. This architectural highlight was built in 1924 by Utrecht architect Gerrit Rietveld and is on the UNESCO World Heritage List for good reason.



In Utrecht, you can find elegant little boutiques, unique stores and famous brands. Stroll via the Oudegracht to **Twijnstraat** and embark on a tour of discovery along this vibrant street with its many speciality shops, bars and restaurants. If you love markets and plants, then the **flower market** at Janskerkhof is a must see. Each Saturday, the square is filled with gorgeous plants and flowers.

Centraal Museum



One of the most trendsetting museums in Utrecht. The **Centraal Museum** is located in a former medieval convent where you can explore the many hallways, staircases and the spacious courtyard. The largest Rietveld collection in the world resides here as well as the studio of illustrator and graphic designer Dick Bruna, the creator of world-famous Miffy.

From the water



Utrecht has an extraordinary relationship with water. Take a boat trip or walk along the 'singel', a route of approximately six kilometres circling the historic city centre. And you simply cannot miss the city's amazing canals and wharfs. It will come as no surprise that Utrecht has been awarded the title of most beautiful canal city in Europe! Hire a boat, canoe or SUP, or book a cruise. Afterwards, you can relax and take in the views at one of the many waterfront cafes.

In the heart of the city centre stands **TivoliVredenburg**, a unique venue for all kinds of music and entertainment. Leave **Utrecht Central Station**, walk across the station square, go underneath the iconic, **bulbous roof** and then enter **Hoog Catharijne** shopping mall. There are 90 stores ranging from well-known fashion chains to small boutiques and more than 30 restaurants. Did you know that Hoog Catharijne is the first shopping centre that allows boaters and canoers to pass under it?



Be enchanted by this fairy-tale castle surrounded by a beautiful formal garden and an equally glorious landscaped park. This historic structure is the largest castle in the Netherlands and was built by a rich baron between 1892 and 1912. Nowadays, you can discover the castle by guided tour or roam around the garden by yourself. Why not have a drink and a bite to eat afterwards at the Tuynhuis?
